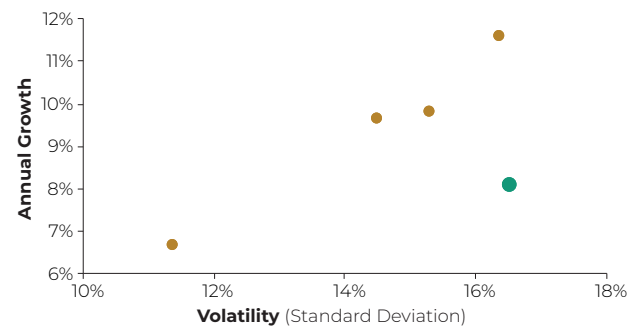

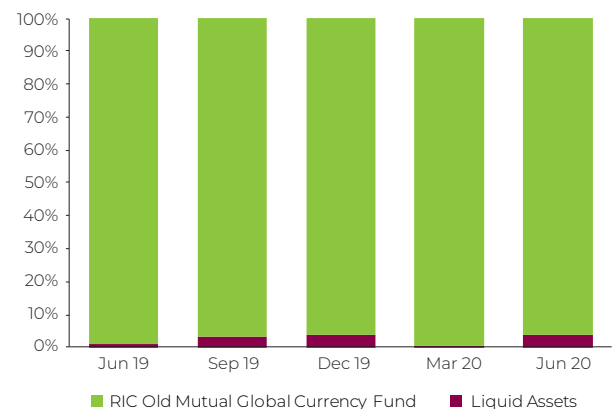
Fund Objective	The fund aims to maximise total return to investors through full exposure to a basket of major foreign currencies by investing in a foreign collective investment scheme focusing on global currencies. Any income earned will be of an incidental nature.
Investor Profile	This fund is aimed at investors who want rand-denominated exposure to a basket of major foreign currencies, while avoiding equity risk. The investor can tolerate exchange rate volatility.
Investment Mandate	Apart from assets in liquid form, the feeder fund holds participatory interests in only one collective investment scheme, the Old Mutual Global Currency Fund, a sub-fund of the Russell Investments Company PLC. This underlying sub-fund will primarily invest in short-term securities with an outstanding term of 12 months or less including commercial paper, banker's acceptances, certificates of deposit and government securities.

- Our cut-off time for client instructions (e.g. buying and selling) is at 15:00 each working day for all our funds, except the Money Market Funds, the price of which is set at 13:00. These are also the times we value our funds to determine the daily ruling price (other than at month-end when we value the Old Mutual Index Funds and Old Mutual Multi-Managers Funds of Funds range at 17:00 close). Daily prices are available on the public website and in the media.
- Unit trusts are traded at ruling prices, may borrow to fund client disinvestments and may engage in script lending. The daily price is based on the current market value of the fund's assets plus income minus expenses (NAV of the portfolio) divided by the number of units on issue.
