FUND OBJECTIVE

The fund aims to generate the maximum possible investment return over a long-term investment horizon.

WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

The fund is suitable for investors requiring long-term growth and who appreciate the nature of this worldwide flexible fund of funds, and who are able to accept the return volatility likely to be associated with its objective of maximising returns.

INVESTMENT MANDATE

The fund of funds invests primarily in a selection of Old Mutual Group collective investment scheme portfolios offering exposure to South African and international assets. While the primary focus is on shares, nothing prevents the fund manager from gaining exposure to bonds, listed property, cash or other asset classes in order to maximise long-term growth. There is no minimum or maximum that the fund must hold in South African or international assets. Derivatives may be used for efficient portfolio management purposes.

REGULATION 28 COMPLIANCE

The fund aims to offer exposure to a specific asset class. It holds a higher allocation to both international assets and equities than what is allowed in terms of Regulation 28 of the Pension Funds Act. This fund is therefore not Regulation 28 compliant.



reversing the 11% fall incurred in the last quarter of 2018. This really illustrates the importance of sticking to one's long-term savings plan, as panicking out of the market at the end of the year would have been very expensive.

Locally, given the constraints facing South Africa, the Budget delivered by Minister Mboweni was sound. Eskom is the elephant in the room. The fragility of our electricity supply and the return of load shedding reinforced the need to urgently tackle the electricity dilemma. It was pleasing to note that Government proposed a solution of splitting Eskom into three companies – we now need to see the follow-through in the coming months. All eyes were on the ratings agencies of late, particularly Moody's, which granted South Africa another reprieve at the end of March. In terms of market performance, the local equity market recovered somewhat (up 4% on the FTSE/JSE Capped SWIX), but this was driven by the performance of the resources and the global names – local sectors were mostly lower over the quarter. Better global sentiment, well-contained inflation and a firm fiscal stance led to local bonds delivering good returns over this period. Attention now turns to the elections in May, following which investors will expect greater clarity on the pace and extent of the local recovery.

The Old Mutual Maximum Return Fund of Funds benefited from the better equity markets and

enjoyed strong returns in the first quarter of 2019. This pulled up the fund's 12-month returns to 5.8%, which is much better than the negative return at the end of 2018. We are happy with this return relative to the 2.6% fall in the South African equity market (FTSE/JSE Capped SWIX Index), but there was a missed opportunity relative to global equity. Over five years, the fund delivered a return of 7.3%. This was basically in line with cash and a real return of around 2% is lower than we would aim to deliver in the medium term.

Looking forward, we think the US equity market is getting more expensive and we sold some global equity into the recent strength. At the same time, we think the severe weakness of the rand over the past year will not be repeated and, as such, we are running with slightly higher South African exposure. This is mainly in interest-bearing assets where South Africa offers very high real returns within a global context. Essentially, the market is pricing in a ratings downgrade to junk, so any good news on the South African economy or political landscape, or no change from ratings agency Moody's, would be positive for these assets. As a high growth fund, we still have 75% invested in growth assets, but hold 25% in interest-bearing assets to protect the fund from any pullback in global markets.

FUND COMMENTARY AS AT 31/03/2019

Investors were, by and large, relieved to bid farewell to 2018. Hopes for a 2019 reversal of fortunes grew and the first quarter didn't disappoint. A more cautious US Federal Reserve (signalling that interest rates are on hold), continued accommodative monetary policy in Europe and Chinese stimulus all contributed to the recovery in risk assets over the quarter. It would also appear that the US and China are making progress on trade talks, while the British parliament indicated that a no-deal Brexit was not a preferred route. Global equities rose over 12% in US dollars over the quarter, largely
